Each week your students will go through the same set of tasks to help them become familiar with common examples of figurative language. Here is an overview of what students will do each day of the week.


- Monday Students read figurative language example in context of 2-3 sentences. They identify the type of figurative language and make a prediction about what it means.
- Tuesday students can use a variety of resources to figure out what figurative language phrase actually means.

Wednesday - Students dig deeper and explain the clues that help them identify the type of figurative language and explain why the author might use this phrase in their writing.

- **Thursday** Students draw a picture or symbol that shows the figurative or literal meaning of the phrase.
- Friday Students create their own figurative language example.

If you are teaching virtually, you can still use this resource. There is a digital version created using Google Slides.




