


# HOMOPHONE OF THE WEEK

Weekly Routines for Jeaching Homophones

## WEEKLY ROUTINE OVERVIEW

Each week your students will go through the same set of tasks to help them become familiar with a specific set of homophones. Here is an overview of what students will do each day of the week.



- Monday Students read two example sentences that contain the homophone used in context.
   Students make a prediction on what each word means.
- Tuesday & Wednesday Students look up the meaning of each word an draw a picture to help them remember the meaning.
- Thursday & Friday Students use each word in a sentence to show they understand the meaning of the individual word.






- Homophone of the Week




