

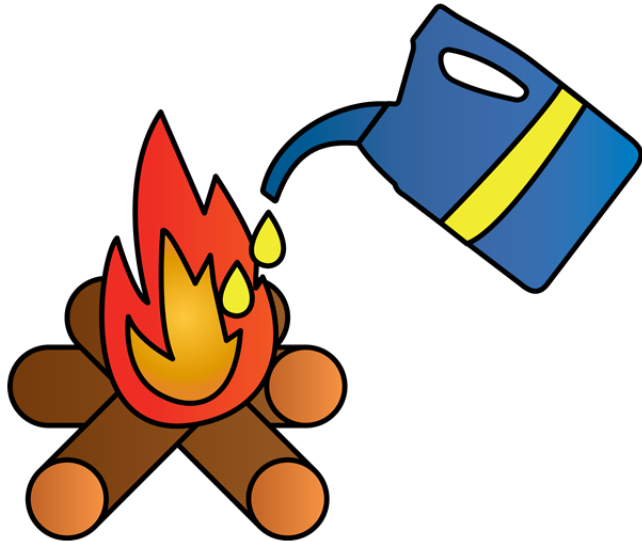

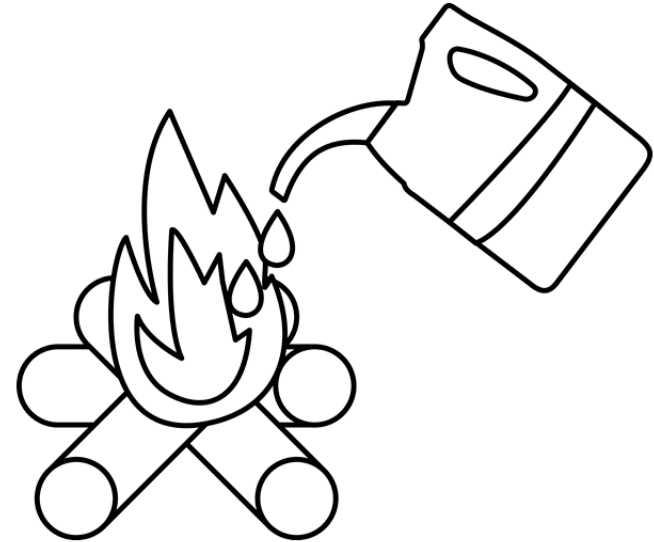

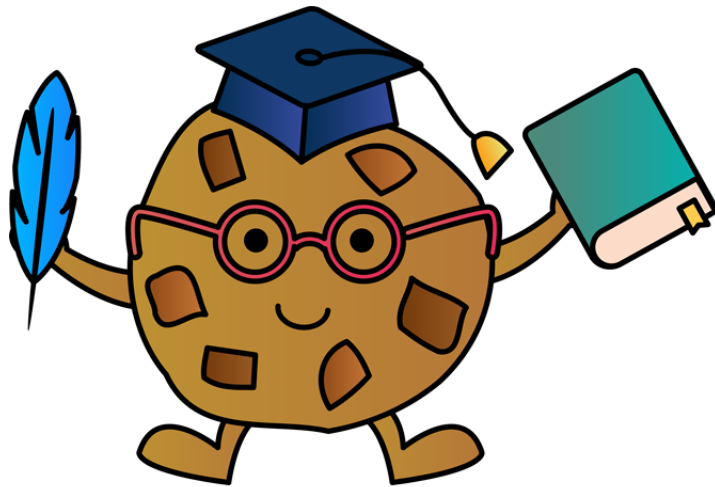

single lesson.

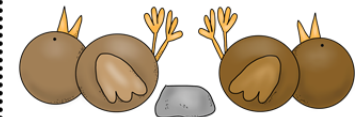
## joined at the hip

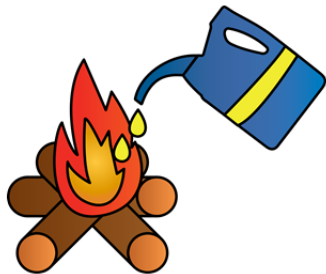
