Characteristics of Haiku Poems

- Haiku poems are only three lines long
- The first line has 5 syllables
- ✤ The 2nd line has 7 syllables
- ✤ The 3rd line has 5 syllables
- ✤ Haiku are usually about nature
- ✤ Haiku poems originated in Japan



- The fourth line has four vords which should be hours.


