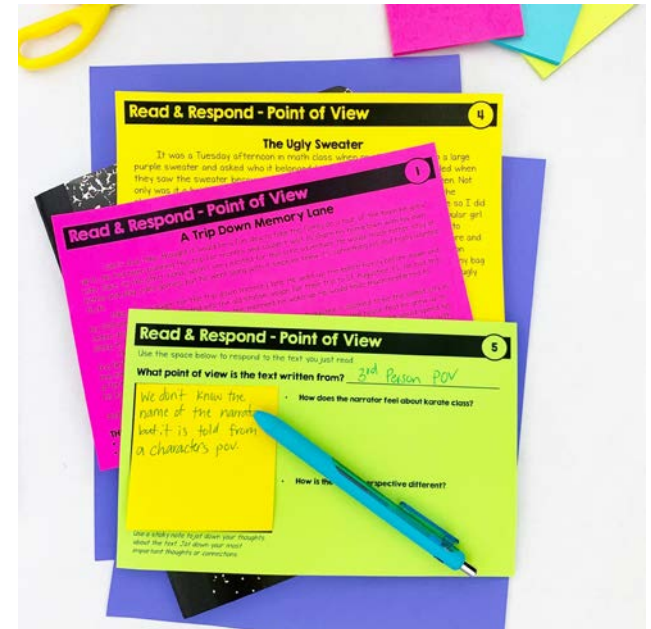
## Task cards can be printed in three different ways.

# WHAT'S INCLUDED?

This resource includes 20 reading task cards that contain short passages that will help you teach, practice, and reinforce how to identify the point of view of a text.

This resource includes the following:

- 7 texts that are written in 1<sup>st</sup> person point of view
- 4 texts that are written in 2<sup>nd</sup> person point of view (these are mostly instructional in nature)
- 8 texts that are written in 3<sup>rd</sup> person point of view

\*The last six task cards include 3 stories that are written from 1<sup>st</sup> person pov and then 3<sup>rd</sup> person pov. These can be used to help students distinguish the difference using the same story line.

\*This task card set doesn't go deep into 3<sup>rd</sup> person limited or 3<sup>rd</sup> person omniscient. It just helps students identify the basic pov of the text.



# Option #1 - Just the Text

One of the printing options for the task cards is to print JUST the text. Each task card has a short reading passage (takes up half a page). The passages lend themselves to identifying point of view, but you really could use them to teach any reading skill.



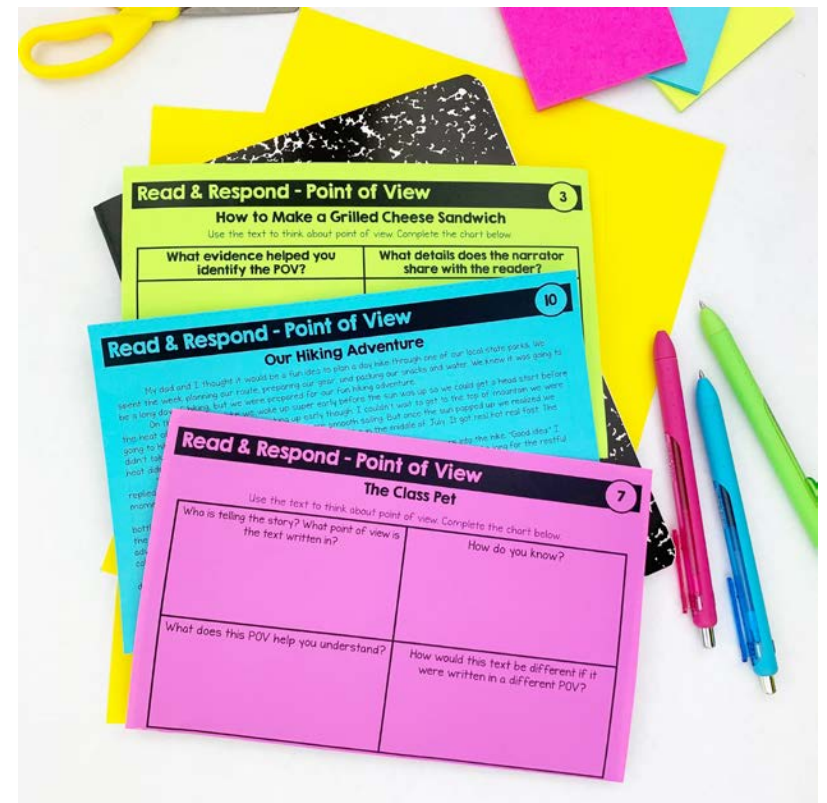
- This set of task cards is ideal if you want to use them in the “traditional” task card way.
- I suggest printing them on cardstock and either putting them all on a book ring or in a photo box.
- There are 3 options of reading response sheets included so students can read the passages and respond on a separate page.

# Option #2 - Passage & Graphic Organizer

One of the printing options includes the passage and a graphic organizer template. These task cards can be printed front and back and work great in a center, as part of your small group instruction, or even for guided practice.

- On the front of each task card is a short reading passage (the same numbers and titles as option #1).
- The bottom of each task card includes a few questions to prompt students thinking about point of view.
- On the back, there is a graphic organizer template that will help students think about the point of view of the narrator.

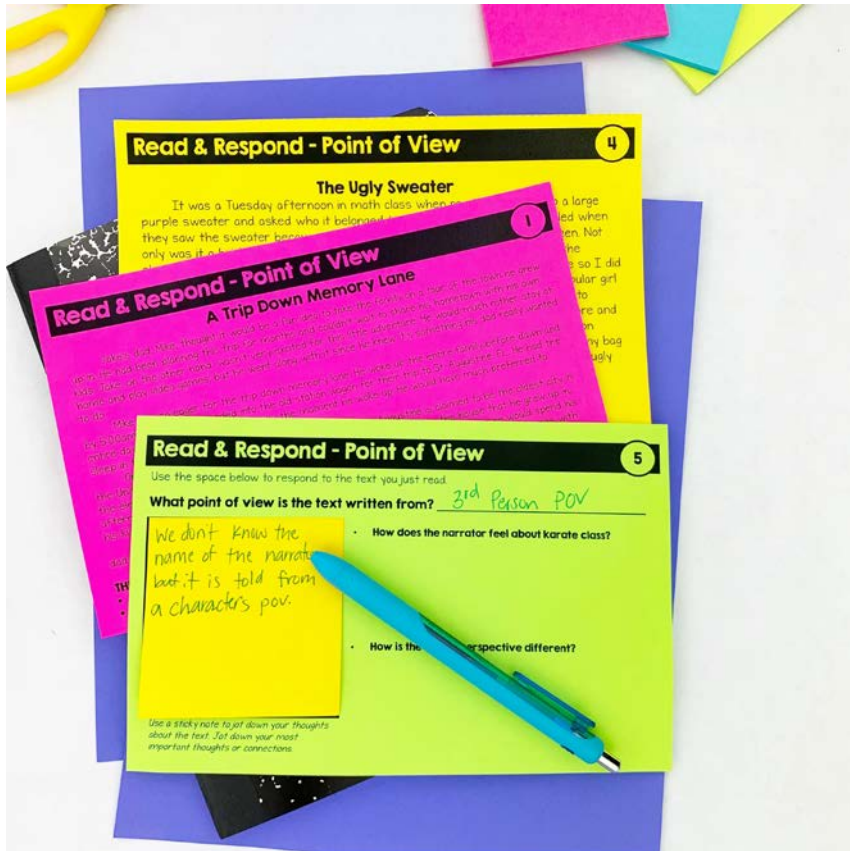

# Option #3 - Passage & Response Questions

- The bottom of each task card includes a few questions to prompt students thinking about point of view.
- On the back, there is space for a sticky note so students can jot down their thinking about the text. There are also two text-based comprehension questions.

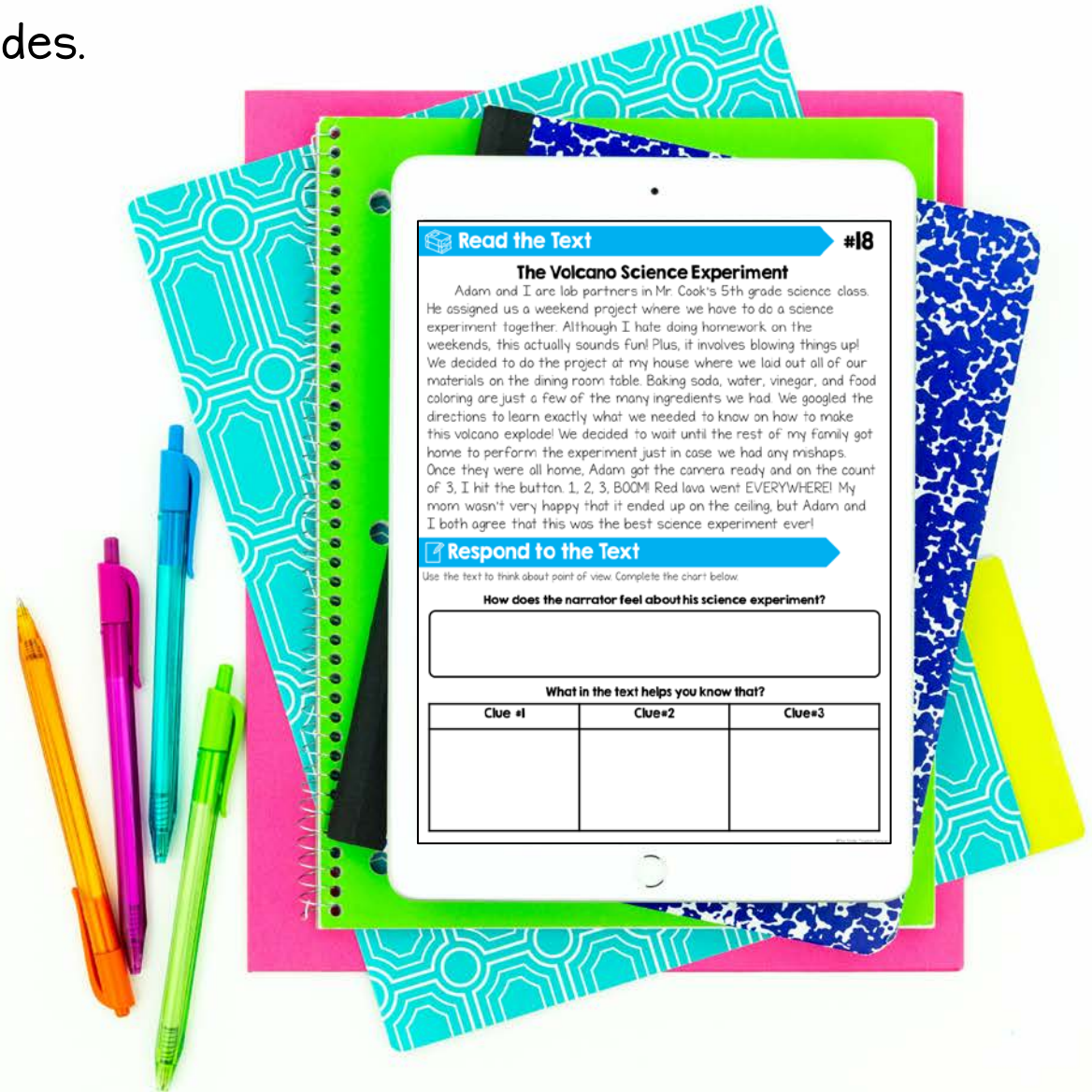

To begin with, spread plenty of butter on the two slices of bread. The most important thing to remember is that the buttered side of the bread does not actually go on the inside of the sandwich, but rather on the outside. The butter prevents the bread from sticking to the skillet, and it gives the grilled cheese its nice golden crust.

Once the bread is ready, place one of your buttered slices face down in a hot skillet. Next you will add the cheese. You can add 2-3 slices of cheese and each slice can be a different variety. Then, you will add your second slice of bread on top of the cheese, but remember to keep the buttered side facing up! Allow the grilled cheese to cook for a little while before flipping it. It should take a few minutes for the bread to get nice and golden. Once both sides of the bread are a beautiful golden brown and the cheese is all melted, you are ready to eat and enjoy.
