

Step I: Read the Passage

Students can read the short reading passage.

Step 2: Think About the Passage

Students can use sticky notes or the blank squares to jot down their thoughts or questions about the text.

Step 3: Organize Your Thinking

Students will rewrite a portion of the story from a different point of view.

Step 4: Respond to the Text

Students can answer 3 comprehension questions about the text.




